ANALYSIS OF STUDENT FEEDBACK


Introduction

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college has been working continuously towards quality improvement and betterment of student learning experience. In order to understand the lag areas of the college and scope for further improvement, feed back has been collected from the students . This report focuses on feedback of students on curriculum, student centric, library facilities, ICT canteen facilities, counselling and as such.

Data Collection and analysis

An effort has been made by the college in order to receive the feedback from the Alumnus on the teaching co-curricular activities, syllabus, curriculum, student centric, library facilities, ICT canteen facilities, counselling and as such . As many as 434 respondents have responded. In order to arrive at the comprehensive results, percentage has been used for effective comparison and analysis.


Data has been collected by preparation of Google form and has been circulated to the alumnus. The details of the analysis is as follows:



Analysis


Total 434 responses were received across all the courses, out of which 33.2% are from BCA, 21.9% from BBA, 16.1% from BBA - AM and 23.5% are from BCOM and 5.3% are from M.Com.








Analysis





4. How well were the teachers able to communicate?






7. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

8. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student


exchange, field visit opportunities for students.


9. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.


10. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.


11. Teachers inform you about expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.


12. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you

13. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.




Analysis


15. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.

16. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.




Analysis

5.8 % of respondents disagreed to the statement. Finally, 3% strongly disagreed towards the statement.


17. The institute/teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.






Analysis


19. Efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.


20. what percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia etc. while teaching.



Analysis






22. Infrastructure and lab facilities available in the college


23. Examination system adopted by college during pandemic


24. Support from administrative office.



Analysis



Analysis




27. Canteen facilities

Observations

- More number of alumnus are satisfied regarding the co-curricular activities provided to them.
- The Majority of the alumnus agreed that institution and faculties helped them in placing.
- Most of the respondents agreed that institution is student centric.
- Majority of the respondents agreed that library facilities, sports, canteen facilities all are good.
- Majority of the respondents accepted that the teachers **use** ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia etc. while teaching.
- Majority of the respondents agreed that mentoring process in the institution is helping the students in developing the cognitive, social and emotional growth.
- Majority of the respondents agreed that administrative staff are very supportive.
- The questions were posed to the respondents to understand the quality of faculties in the institutions like teacher's encouragement, quality of teaching, syllabus completion and as such majority of the respondents have a positive feedback about the faculties.
- It is found that teaching-learning process in the institutions are excellent.

Recommendations

- There is always a scope to improvise in the area of placements in the institution. This can be achieved by industry academic collaboration, internship, placement trainings, mock interviews and as such.
- The institution can focus more on placement training, extra-curricular activities and a like.
- There is a scope to improvise the library facilities by giving access to online journals and as such. The library also can provide training on SWAYAM and MOOC and as such to the students.
- There is a scope for further improvement in areas of usage of ICT like Google Sites and as such.
- The institution can appoint expertized people to mentor the students.
- The institution can take initiation to introduce the work profile of the administrative staff to the students during the orientation in order to maintain cordial relationships.
- The institutions can train the faculties in the area of mentoring the students, usage of ICT, specialized training courses in the area of teaching and a like.
- The faculties are advised to encourage the students for article writing, paper publication which in turn helps students to enrich their knowledge.
