

To ensure respectful and dignified behaviour and to maintain a standard at the workplace, the Institute sensitizes all the employees and follows up regularly. After admission, the new students are to bring to the sense of sensitization by regular sessions within the induction and the orientation programmes. From admission onwards the new students are to have their sessions with the psychological counsellor to positively influence them for their learning and emotional well-being.

From the beginning, the new students are to provide a mentor (who will be a teacher of his /her department).
